Hope Through Housing Kicks off its Afterschool Program with Free Backpacks Stuffed with Back-to-School Supplies for Students

More than 500 children in grades K-6 will receive free backpacks stuffed with back-to-school supplies donated by Staples® during a "Project Learning Start" event.

RANCHO CUCAMONGA, Calif. – Based in Rancho Cucamonga, Hope Through Housing Foundation (Hope) is kicking off its After School & Beyond program by giving children from low-income families the school supplies they need to succeed.
